

In 2007, Laurie became the Director of Purchasing, including surplus property, countywide mail operations and printing services.

She has a Bachelor’s Degree in Business Administration and the designations of Certified Purchasing Manager from the Institute for Supply Management and Certified Public Procurement Official by the Universal Public Procurement Certification Council.

Under Laurie’s direction, the County has earned the Achievement of Excellence in Procurement award every year; implemented electronic procurement and performance measurement; adopted “best value” procurement as County policy; endorsed Cal-State University’s development of a public procurement certificate program; established a regional vendor show; served on various committees for policy development, budgetary streamlining and interdepartmental projects; and the Purchasing Department has achieved cost savings related to numerous contract initiatives.

She is active in the California Association of Public Procurement Officials, currently serves on the Legislative and Position Committee of the National Institute of Governmental Purchasing and was recently a panel member discussing Global Best Practices at the Institute for Public Procurement annual conference.

The AGA Professional Development Training was one of the best training events I have ever attended. The keynote speakers were captivating! I highly recommend this training to all accountants and auditors who would like to improve their technical and soft skills.

My experience - Tobi Babalola

I've been a member of the AGA for about 4 years, and this year I was able to attend the PDT at Anaheim, California. It was an eye-opening experience in that I met a lot of federal and state government employees who perform various functions ranging from budgeting to auditing to controllership to accounting for covert agencies like the CIA.

I was particularly impressed with opening morning sessions featuring the current Comptroller-General of the United States as well as an Under-Secretary from the Department of Homeland Security. The fact that the immediate past Comptroller General of the U.S. was a speaker at one of the sessions I attended was also mind-blowing because I simply felt surrounded by giants of government finance.

In spite of the presence of financial 'stars', I quickly realized at the PDT that the AGA was adequately committed to the professional development of attendees from the millennial generation. This commitment was evident in the inclusion of several sessions on the program geared towards issues affecting young government finance officers. Topics discussed in these sessions include: "How to succeed in your Multi-generational workplace", "Certified Government Financial Manager", and "Workforce of the future" amongst others.


