
Chapter Year 2017-2018 Was Again a Very Successful Year for the Chicago Chapter

Thank you to our members and the Chapter Executive Committee for another great Chapter year!

Our Chapter provided 41 hours of continuing professional education. All of the educational events were highly rated based on the feedback and evaluations we received. The Chapter's Professional Development Training program in May 2018 was the highlight of the year attracting great speakers and 61 attendees. The Chapter maintained its accreditation as a CPE sponsor by the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy. We also gave back to the community through a book drive, the Chicago Veterans Ruck March, 2018 Chicago Honor Ride, and participating in the VITA tax preparation assistance program. Our members attended AGA's National Professional Development Training and the Sectional Leadership Meeting.

To foster our relationships with future accounting professionals and potential Early Career Members, we awarded Chapter scholarships to two local college students. In addition, the Chapter staffed an exhibition table at the Institute of Internal Auditors Chicago Chapter's 58th Annual Seminar in Rosemont, IL.

The Chicago Chapter's efforts culminated with achieving Platinum Status in AGA's Chapter Recognition Program and earning a 2018 Chapter Education Award from AGA.
