Continuing Education

During the 2018-2019 program year, the Chapter offered 49 continuing professional education (CPE) credits to its members and other government professionals through chapter-sponsored webinars, members-only webinars, a Spring Forum, an annual dinner meeting, chapter-sponsored trainings and "Lunch & Learn" events. The webinars covered a wide range of professional topics, including "Communications", "Ethics", "Internal Control", "Grants Management", "Data Act", and several other fraud, analytical, and leadership topics. Over 100 individuals attended these offerings throughout the span of the program year. Chapter members also met with local college students and professors to promote membership within the chapter, to offer resume workshops and to extend information for obtaining a job within the federal government. Chapter members continued to assist an Ohio Valley University (OVU) professor, who added Governmental Accounting to the OVU accounting curriculum.

CGFM Success

During the 2018-2019 program year, AGA MOV was able to offer Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) courses for those interested in becoming a CGFM. This is a professional certification, awarded by AGA National, that demonstrates competency in governmental accounting, financial reporting, internal controls and budgeting. It is a respected credential as it recognizes the specialized knowledge and experience of the certification holder. Of the AGA MOV membership, 32 members are CGFMs. The chapter is hopeful to build off of this success and will continue to promote and market the CGFM certification.

State and Local Proclamation



Revenues and Expenses


