Digital Accountability and Transparency Act (DATA Act)

further expanded transparency efforts.

- Linking federal contract, loan, and grant spending information to federal agency programs.
- Established government-wide data standards
- Holding agencies accountable for the completeness and accuracy of data submitted



Reporting On Use of Funds

- Sets the requirements for monthly reporting of COVID obligations and expenditures
- Establishes the use of data elements required to comply with FFATA

OMB Memorandum M-20-21



Implementation Guidance for Supplemental
Funding Provided in response to the Coronavirus
Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

Allows agencies and recipients to meet the CARES Act reporting requirements by utilizing, with minimal modifications, existing reporting requirements and processes under FFATA, as amended by the DATA Act.

Monthly Reporting



Effective for the June 2020 reporting period

- Agencies with COVID-19 relief funding must submit DATA Act Files A, B and C on a monthly basis
- Files B and C must report COVID-19 related DEFC values
- Report a running total of outlays for each award in File C for all awards containing a DEFC value

CARES Act — § 15011(b)(1)(A) On a monthly basis until September 30, 2021, each agency shall report to the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, the Bureau of Fiscal Service in the Department of the Treasury, the Committee, and the appropriate congressional committees on any obligation or expenditure of large covered funds, including loans and awards.




Management of Reporting and Data Integrity Risks



CARES and DATA Act requires,

- Quality information to be published on USASpending.gov
- The identification and assessment of risks to reporting objectives and regulatory requirements over data quality
- Continued use of the Data Quality Plan until COVID-19 response funds are expended.





Pandemic Response and Accountability Committee



The Pandemic Response Accountability Committee (PRAC) was established as a committee of the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE) by the CARES Act.

The mission of the PRAC is to:

- Promote transparency and support independent oversight of the funds provided by the CARES Act and other related <u>pandemic relief legislation</u>, now totaling more than \$5 trillion, and
- Provide oversight of those funds and the coronavirus response.
